**DELEGATIONS/PRESENTATIONS/PETITIONS****Brantford to Cambridge Transportation Corridor EA – Draft Terms of Reference**

Fred Leech, MTO, advised that the draft Environmental Assessment Terms of Reference for the Brantford to Cambridge Transportation Corridor was released on September 2, 2008, with four public information centres scheduled over the coming month to provide information and receive input from the public. The purpose of the study is to prepare a transportation development strategy to address long-term area transportation system problems and opportunities (to 2031) relative to the inter-regional movement of people and goods in the Brantford – Cambridge area. Mr. Leech provided an overview of the study, the analysis area and the framework of the individual EA process, noting that the study is not anticipated to be completed until 2013. He pointed out that this study replaces the former Highway 24 corridor study, and that a larger analysis area has been approved to include the Trussler Road corridor.

Mike Delsey, TSH, reviewed some of the preliminary transportation system problems and opportunities that have been identified in the study, as well as some of the alternatives that will be reviewed as part of this Study. He also outlined the key aspects of the Consultation and Engagement Plan as it relates to the public, municipalities, key stakeholder groups and First Nations.

**Closure of Main Street South for St. George Apple Fest**

Linda Bell of Lynn Bell Designs expressed her concern that Council had made decisions about road closures for the St. George Apple Fest without the input of local merchants or residents who may be affected. The merchants and residents who are affected by the closure of Main Street South to Victor Boulevard were not advised of the proposed closure that will

interfere with customers and the delivery of goods to their businesses. In the opinion of those affected, this closure is unacceptable and unnecessary, as is the compromise being suggested by the Apple Fest Committee to only close the street to Thompson Street. Ms. Bell suggested that the Apple Fest Committee find alternate locations to hold events during the Festival, rather than closing streets, as the detours cause traffic congestion and unsafe conditions for the residents on detour streets.

Shirley Steedman, on behalf of the St. George Apple Fest Committee, advised that it has come to their attention that there are objections to the closure of Main Street South to the northern entrance of Victor Boulevard. The Apple Fest Committee held a community meeting in August and had recommended these closures due to pedestrian safety concerns at Main Street South and High Street last year. She outlined the events that were planned for the portion of Main Street South between High Street and Victor Boulevard, and noted that the Committee was willing to change events to scale back the Main Street South closure to Thompson Street, with the exception of the street closure for one hour on Sunday for the Golden Helmets display. Ms. Steedman noted that the Lawn Bowling Club had scheduled a tournament for September 20 at the club on Thompson Street.

In order to accommodate the lawn bowling tournament, Councillor Wheat suggested that the street closure be moved one block north to the north side of South Street. The two presenters noted their concurrence with this suggestion.

### **Moyer Planning Application**

Susan Wakely, 251 Old Onondaga Road East, advised that she is opposed to the Moyer development that is proposed across the road from her property due to the fact that the creation of another five lots will threaten the water source. She provided details on the wells in the area and questioned the reports done by Naylor Engineering regarding these wells. Ms. Wakely noted that their well had gone dry this year when there was sustained pumping at the house across the road. She is concerned that with ten new lots across the road, there will be a major problem with the quantity of water for the current residents in this area. Ms. Wakely requested that a peer review of the Naylor reports be carried out. If the peer review is in agreement with the Naylor reports, she will drop her appeal of the planning decisions in regard to the Moyer proposed severances.

Mary Lou Paine, 260 Old Onondaga Road East, provided information on the history of their property at 260 Old Onondaga Road East, noting that there was an existing well on the property when they purchased it. She noted her concerns with the water quality, quantity and drainage in the area. She provided information on instances when their well has gone dry, even though they use a cistern to supplement their well. Ms. Paine explained that drainage was not a problem on her property until the road was rebuilt. Now the water run-off from the road goes across her property and comes close to her well, which makes the well highly susceptible to water contamination. She expressed concern that she was not notified of the August 20 Planning Advisory Committee meeting when this application was discussed, nor was she advised of well testing arranged by Cohoon Engineering on her property. The proposal for the five new lots includes a drainage ditch at the back of the new properties that will affect her property and her well. Ms. Paine advised that since 2005, their property has had water contamination, depletion and quality issues, and the approval of another five lots will further exacerbate this situation. She requested that Council protect the water and waterways in the area and vote against the development of five more lots on Old Onondaga Road East.

Joe Cohoon, on behalf of the property owner George Moyer, advised that five lots have previously been approved for severance and that this application will bring the total lots to ten. He provided information on the testing done by Naylor and Robert Dennis Well Drilling that indicates that the additional five lots will not have an adverse affect on the water supply of the other residents in this area.

Mr. Cohoon advised that there is no explanation for the wells going dry at 260 and 251 Old Onondaga Road East on the same day, as they are located in two different aquifers. He noted that the severances have been approved by the Committee of Adjustment and all conditions have been met with the exception of the rezoning of the property. Planning staff supports the rezoning of the property, and the Planning Advisory Committee recommended approval, subject to satisfactory results from the well testing. He requested that Council approve the rezoning application, as the applicant has fulfilled all the conditions as required.

In response to questions, Mr. Cohoon advised that the original well testing was done in March 2007, and that all of the proposed lots will include a drilled well, supplemented by a cistern to reduce the well usage.

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

Councillor Coleman presented the following report from the September 9, 2008 meeting of the Public Works Committee:

1. Whereas the owner of 100 Consolidated Drive, Paris, has proposed the construction of a third entrance to facilitate industrial expansion on the subject lands;

And whereas Schedule "A" – Property Entrance Guidelines of County By-Law 176-99 (Entrance By-Law) specifies a maximum of two (2) entrances for industrial properties;

And whereas the location for the proposed entrance is suitable for the industrial expansion;

Be it hereby resolved that the owner of 100 Consolidated Drive be authorized to construct a third entrance for the proposed industrial expansion, provided that the entrance be subject to the County of Brant Development and Engineering Standards and all other terms of County By-law 176-99.

2. Whereas staff has identified a discrepancy between the County of Brant and the County of Oxford Speed Limit By-laws on the boundary road known as County Highway #2;

And whereas 50 km/hr speed limit signs are posted on County Highway #2 for both eastbound and westbound directions located within the County of Brant's 70 km/hr by-law zone;

Be it hereby resolved that Speed Limit By-law #182-05, Schedule J, be amended by reducing the speed limit on County Highway #2 from 70 km/hr to 50 km/hr, from 800 metres west of Middle Townline Road to 85 metres east of Middle Townline Road;

And that no field modifications are required.

3. Whereas Trow and Associates have submitted details of a pilot study to maximize the diversion of household organics materials and recycling;

And whereas there are sufficient funds available for the study;

Be it therefore resolved that the County proceed with the establishment of a working group comprised of 2 staff members and 3 Public Works Committee members to address the details of the pilot study proposal.

4. Whereas to complete the reconstruction of a portion of King Edward Street following the installation of sanitary sewer, a portion of Rest Acres Road will need to be closed to traffic;

Whereas the traffic will be detoured along Hanlon Place to King Edward Street;

And whereas By-Law 157-08 will require to be repealed due to timelines specified now being insufficient to complete the restoration of King Edward Street;

Be it hereby resolved that By-Law 157-08 be repealed and that a By-Law be passed to close Rest Acres Road from Hanlon Place to King Edward Street for approximately 5 days during the period of September 29 to October 3, 2008.

5. Whereas the County has received a Recommendation for Award from RV Anderson Associates Limited as per their letter of September 5, 2008, with regard to "WD 2-08 Mt. Pleasant Water Facility Upgrades";

And whereas there are sufficient funds in the approved 2008 budget to complete the project this year;

Be it hereby resolved that in reliance upon the recommendations of RV Anderson Associates Limited, dated September 5, 2008, that tender WD 2-08 "Mt. Pleasant Water Facility Upgrades" be awarded to Stone Town Construction Limited for the bid price of \$1,422,503.30 (excluding GST).

6. That Public Works staff co-ordinate an on-site meeting between Mayor Eddy, Councillors Coleman and Chambers and representatives of the Grand River Conservation Authority, to discuss solutions to the erosion matter on the Nith River, in the vicinity of the Penman's Pass Bridge.
7. Subsequent to the on site meeting of September 8, 2008, between County of Brant Public Works staff, County of Brant Community Services staff and representatives of the Burford Lions Club, whereat it was agreed that:
- a) the County of Brant would provide, free of charge, the granular B material required for the construction of the base for trail works being conducted within Lions Art Cadman Park; and
  - b) the Burford Lions Club would pay for the cost of the transportation and placement of said granular B material;

Be it hereby resolved that the County of Brant will supply the granular B material required for the construction of the base for trail works being conducted within Lions Art Cadman Park.

8. Whereas the Burford Lions Club has requested that the County of Brant truck the stone dust, as donated by the Brant Waterways Foundation, from LaFarge Quarries, to the Lions Art Cadman Park;

Be it hereby resolved that the request of the Burford Lions Club that the County of Brant Public Works Department truck the stone dust from LaFarge Quarries to the Lions Art Cadman Park be approved.

9. That the joint County of Brant / City of Brantford tender RFT 08-161, Supply and Delivery of Road Salt for the 2008-2009 Winter Season for the County of Brant be awarded to Sifto Canada Inc., 6700 Century Avenue, Suite 202, Mississauga, ON L5N 6A4 for the price of \$68.26 per tonne plus GST, this being the only tender received.

10. That the request received from the Burford Agricultural Society to place a sign at the southwest corner of the intersection at Park Avenue and King Street from on or about October 1, 2008 to on or about October 14, 2008, advertising the Burford Fall Fair, be approved.
