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1. INTRODUCTION

The County of Brant is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) to determine the recommended solution to provide enhanced transportation capacity on Rest Acres Road between King Edward Street and Highway 403 as shown on Exhibit 1-1. The purpose of this transportation capacity enhancement is to accommodate future approved growth in Southwest Paris to 2031, as included in the County of Brant Official Plan (2010) and recommended in the County of Paris Transportation Master Plan (2008).

The study will follow the Schedule “C” provisions of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000 as amended 2007) where stakeholder engagement and subsequent communication with the public are important requirements of this process, as detailed in this Consultation Plan.

2. PURPOSE

One of the key elements in delivering a quality Class EA is the implementation of a strong Consultation Plan. The County of Brant understands that one purpose of the Class EA process is to inform stakeholders about the undertaking being planned, and to allow stakeholders to adjust their plans and proposals in order to enhance their benefits and to minimize their environmental impacts.

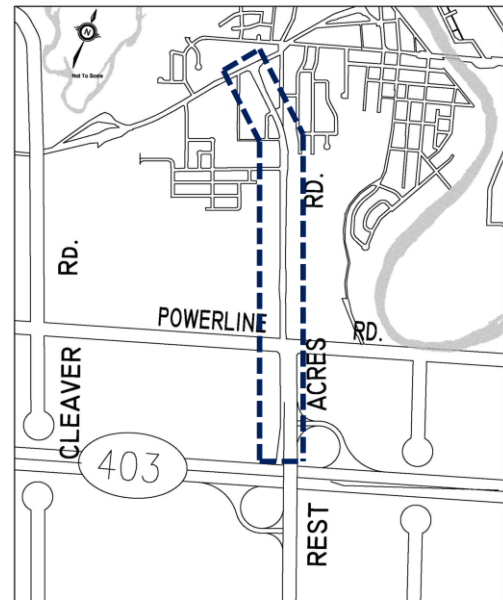
A stakeholder can be defined as any person, agency or group that has an interest in the project or could be potentially affected by its implementation and operation. The purpose of this Consultation Plan is to provide a guide on how to work directly with these individuals and groups throughout the Class EA process, to ensure that their concerns, ideas and plans are consistently understood and considered in the decision making process.

3. IDENTIFICATION OF STAKEHOLDERS AND PUBLIC CONTACTS

IBI Group contacted the Paris area public and stakeholders during the Transportation Master Plan preparation in 2007/08, and more recently as part of the Paris Bypass EA. These contact lists were used in part to prepare a new stakeholder and public contacts list specifically for the Rest Acres Road Class EA. This list will be continuously updated as required throughout the Class EA process. Identified stakeholders can be divided and classified into the following three categories:

1. **Affected Stakeholders:** Individuals and organizations within the study area who may be directly or indirectly affected, either positively or negatively by the study. Affected stakeholders include:

Exhibit 1-1: Study Area



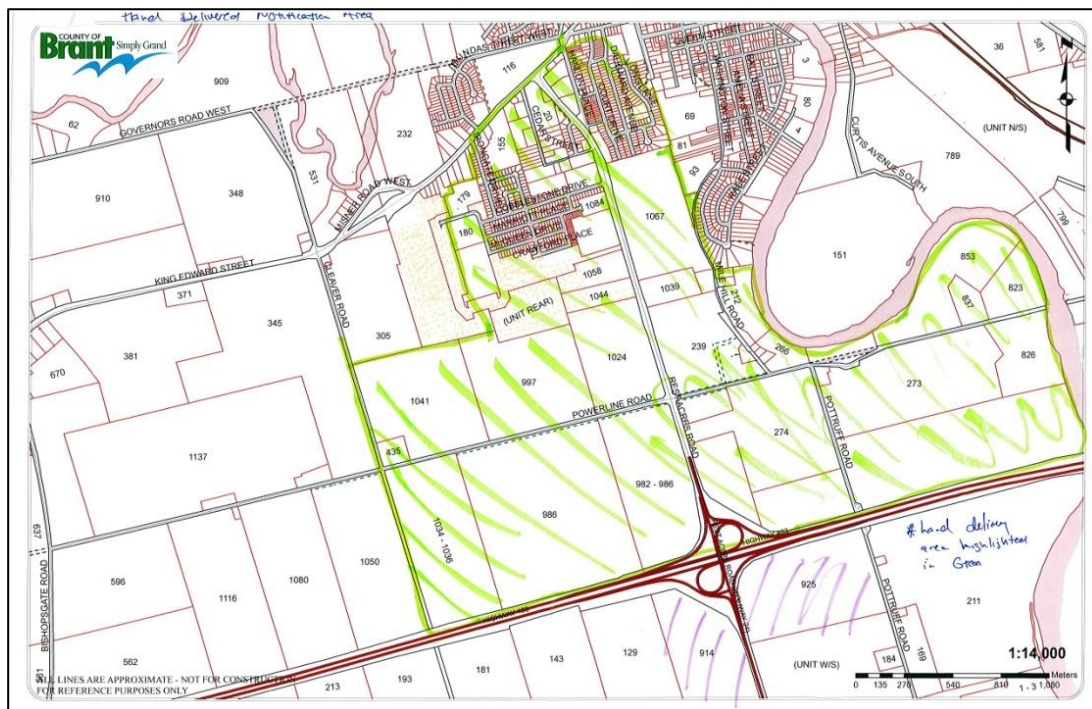
- Residents and property owners in the vicinity of the study area as defined by the County in the area shown on Exhibit 3-1 as having a potential interest in Rest Acres Road as a primary travel route or who own property and/or reside near the road;
- Businesses or business owners adjacent to Rest Acres Road;
- Local associations, clubs, and other interest groups; and
- First Nations/Aboriginal Communities.

2. Influenced Stakeholders: Agencies and organizations such as the GRCA, MTO and MNR that may be able to influence the outcome of the study, either because:

- They can contribute knowledge, ideas or policies to improve project design or mitigate environmental and social impacts; or
- They have personal, political, regulatory or legal influence on the project that needs to be considered.

3. Other Stakeholders: Others individuals outside of the study area and Affected Stakeholder area who may be interested in potential capacity improvements to Rest Acres Road and its associated benefits and impacts. These stakeholders are typically identified through local newspaper notices. In the case of this EA, the County decided to advertise the Notice of Study Commencement in the *Brantford Expositor*.

4. NOTIFICATION AND COMMUNICATION

As part of the Class EA process, formal initial notification letters will first be prepared and mailed through Canada Post to:

- First Nation Agencies and Aboriginal Communities identified as having an interest in the study area;
- Director of the Environmental Assessment and Approvals Branch; and
- Regional Director of the Ministry of the Environment.

The purpose of these letters is to notify required agencies and Aboriginal Communities on matters surrounding the study and the selected Class EA process.

A Notice of Commencement and Public Information Centre (PIC) will next be developed and mailed to contacts at selected Provincial Ministries who are requested to provide feedback, as required by the Class EA process. The Notice will be posted in the Brantford Expositor on Saturday, June 11 and 18, 2011, describing the project and how to receive further information (normally from the project web site). In addition, the Notice will be hand delivered by the County to addresses in the vicinity of the study area specified by the pink and green highlighted areas in **Error! Reference source not found..**

Once the initial Notification has been issued, comments from interested stakeholders will be used to establish future contact where required throughout the study. Engaging stakeholders early on is a key component of an effective Consultation Plan, and will allow for utilization of comments near the beginning of the study. Furthermore, any concerns and comments will be integrated into the Environmental Study Report (ESR) that will document the decision making process in developing solutions for improving capacity along Rest Acres Road.

Correspondence received and responses sent from all project stakeholders will be documented and maintained in a consultation record database. The database will include a summary of the contents, the actions taken in response (including the dates and nature of the follow-up actions), and any other relevant information.

4.1 Stakeholder Meetings

We expect that the most interested external agencies will be MTO, the GRCA and the Six Nations of the Grand First Nations and Confederacy Council. For MTO, the project limits will be within 400 metres of their current Zone of Control from Highway 403 and Provincial Highway 24, south of the highway. Furthermore, MTO has initiated the acquisition of Rest Acres Road from Highway 403 north to Powerline Road so their role in this Municipal Class EA as a co-proponent must be confirmed, including any requirement to address the MTO's EA process.

Three (3) meetings are also planned with the Six Nations Public Works Committee to keep them informed of the study progress. First Nations interests in the area are expected to focus on archaeological and heritage impacts, as well as preservation of natural features. The first meeting will be on June 28, 2011 when the County will review the status of a number of public works projects with the Committee. The second meeting is proposed in Late September following the second Public Consultation Centre (PIC), and the third meeting in mid-December, 2011.

Stakeholder meetings with the GRCA and MTO will be held on an as-required basis.

4.2 Public Information Centres

The Request for Proposal issued for this project requires three (3) Public Information Centre’s (PIC), as does the Schedule “C” Class EA process. All three sessions are proposed to be held in an open house drop-in format where project team members will be available to answer questions and address concerns. The purpose of the PICs will generally be to present information on the study at key points in the study process and to allow for stakeholder feedback and input. Table 4-1 displays when each PIC will be held and what information will be presented.

For each PIC, IBI Group will be responsible for:

- Developing a Notice of PIC for mailout, advertising and placement on the project web site;
- Preparing all necessary displays for the PIC;
- Mail the Notice of PIC to all stakeholders identified on the established project contact list;
- Prepare a Comment Sheet;
- Attend and facilitate the PIC; and
- Compile comments received and responses provided in a PIC Summary Report;

The County of Brant will be responsible for:

- Arranging to have the Notice of PIC advertised in the Brantford Expositor and/or other selected local newspaper, and hand delivered to the pink and green highlighted areas specified in Exhibit 3-1;
- Updating study information on the County of Brant website;
- Selecting and booking an appropriate venue location (i.e. the Paris Fire Hall); and
- Ensuring appropriate County staff attends the PIC.

4.3 Stakeholder Outreach

During development of the Class EA, stakeholders will have open opportunity to contact the designated Project Team representatives (Matt D'Hondt, Don Drackley) or the County with questions, comments and ideas. This input typically occurs the most immediately following PICs, but can take place at any time during the EA process. IBI Group will draft responses to all stakeholder input for County review and approval to respond to the stakeholder.

As with all consultation input provided during the EA process, stakeholder input and responses will be filed in the project record and included in the Technical Appendix to the Environmental Study Report. As such, all stakeholder input and response will become part of the public record. All formal invitations for public input such as PIC comment sheets will include the following notice:

Under the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act and the Environmental Assessment Act, unless otherwise stated in the submission, any personal information such as name, address, telephone number and property location included in a submission will become part of the public record files for this matter and will be released, if requested, to any person

5. ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT COMPLETION

5.1 Notice of Study Completion

A Notice of Study Completion will be prepared by IBI Group and posted in the Brantford Expositor and/or other local newspaper as determined by the County, and mailed to all interested agencies, stakeholders and members of the public specified on the project contact list. The County of Brant will be responsible for arranging the newspaper advertisements. The Notice will inform the public that the project has been completed and will summarize final study recommendations. It will also specify the public review period of 30 calendar days where the Environmental Study Report (ESR) can be reviewed and comments submitted to the project team and the County. The Notice will describe the process to elevate, or "bump-up" the EA through a Part II Order request should there be major issues that cannot be resolved.

The public review period will extend from the Notice of Study Completion in mid-December to mid or late January, 2012 as an opportunity for any concerns about the project to be formally reported to the Minister of the Environment and the County of Brant. Meetings will be held with any concerned residents or stakeholders with the objective to resolve concerns and avoid any Part II Orders. IBI Group will maintain a record of all such input, and work with the County in addressing this input and resolve any issues.

5.2 Statement of Completion

A Statement of Completion will be developed by IBI Group and issued to the Ministry of the Environment, detailing the Class EA Process and intention to proceed with recommendations detailed in the ESR. This will also be posted on the County of Brant's website.

6. CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT COMPLIANCE

This Consultation Plan complies with the mandatory consultation requirements of the Municipal Class EA process by:

- Describing who will be consulted, what they will be consulted about and when and how they will be consulted;
- Providing for early and continuing consultation through the EA process;
- Advertising project notices in two consecutive weeks of a local newspaper; and
- Holding three (3) PICs during the process as formal points of public contact (**Note:** The Schedule “C” Class EA process requires two mandatory points of contact with the third point occurring when the ESR document is put on the public record for review, so this Consultation Plan provides for one additional formal point of contact than that required by the process).
