


**Notice of Public Information Centre No.3
Class Environmental Assessments for
St. George Water and Wastewater Servicing**

The Study

The community of St. George in the County of Brant is currently serviced by a municipal groundwater supply system and a wastewater treatment plant. Upgrades to these services are required to improve the security of the water supply and to address deficiencies at the existing wastewater treatment plant, which include lack of redundancy and capacity limitations.



The Process

In May 2014, the County initiated two separate, concurrent Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) studies to plan for the water and wastewater servicing upgrades required for St. George.

The Class EA studies are being conducted in accordance with the requirements of Schedule C projects of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document (Municipal Engineers Association, October 2000 as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015). As part of the studies, alternative servicing solutions and design concepts have been identified and evaluated. Preliminary preferred servicing concepts have been selected to minimize community, natural environmental and economic impacts.

Public Consultation

Public consultation is an integral component of the Class EA studies. The County wants to ensure that anyone interested in the study has an opportunity to get involved and provide input. Two separate Public Information Centres have been held in May and September 2014 to present results of activities completed at that time, the next steps in the process and to gather feedback from the public and review agencies. Specific additional investigations have been undertaken between 2014 and 2017 to support the activities and preliminary recommendations of the Class EA studies. A third Public Information Centre (PIC) will be held to present the results of the evaluation of alternative design concepts, the findings and recommendations of the specific investigations and the preliminary preferred water and wastewater servicing concepts.
