



Tree Conservation Worksheet

The County of Brant regulates the injury or destruction of trees in woodlots and woodlands that are 0.2 hectares or greater in size, and trees within and adjacent to natural areas such as wetlands, watercourses, and steep slopes. Exemptions are provided for limited tree removal.

It is the property owner(s) responsibility to ensure that any injury or destruction of trees complies with the Good Forestry Practices By-Law 70-21. If you are planning to injure or destroy trees that do not comply with By-Law 70-21, a Clear Cutting Permit will be required.
