The Brant Community Health Hub: Community Generosity Continues to Grow

County of Brant, ON – The Brant Community Health Hub continues to receive generous donations which is turning a dream into a reality.

“We are incredibly thankful to Bob and Helen Darby who donated \$25,000 and Isaac Rosebrugh who donated \$10,000 towards the Brant Community Health Hub,” said Mayor David Bailey. “Our community is so fortunate to have so many citizens and businesses who are willing and able to make a positive impact in the County of Brant. Together, we will build a healthy community.”

The cost of the Brant Community Health Hub is approximately 13 million dollars and a \$2 million dollar fundraising campaign will help lower costs. The fundraising campaign team has been seeking out major donations since early 2021.

Bob and Helen Darby shared, “We are pleased to support the Brant Community Health Hub. We chose to donate as this facility will offer integrated health care and community services in an eco-friendly building. The Brant Community Health Hub will also be close to home for people in our community and it will help to reduce the burden on our overextended hospital system.”

The Brant Community Health Hub, located at 25 Curtis Ave. N., Paris, will be approximately 42,000 square feet. It will offer a range of community health care and services under one roof including family physicians, health care practitioners, community support agencies, health supplies, and other health care and social services.

Isaac Rosebrugh, a fundraising committee member, noted “As a life-long resident of the County, I feel it’s important to give back to the community that I’ve been fortunate enough to call home my entire life. Individual contributions are very important to the success of this project. They say it takes a village and it truly does. As our County grows, I think it’s important that we have access to not only quality, local health care options, but also to the very important services offered through key non-profit organizations that currently do not have a physical service location in the County.”

Improving access to health care and community services in the County of Brant has been identified by the County of Brant Council and the healthcare community as a vitally important and growing need.

The Brant Community Health Hub is expected to open its doors in fall 2021.
