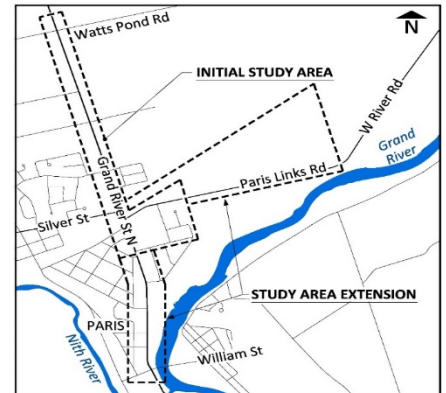


**Grand River Street North  
 Class Environmental Assessment**

The County of Brant has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) for the planning of transportation network improvements to Grand River Street North between Watts Pond Road and William Street, and along the abandoned rail corridor adjacent to Paris Links Road. The recommended improvements will address the transportation needs identified in the Transportation Master Plan and accommodate all road users, while supporting the existing institutions, businesses, and planned development growth.



The Grand River Street North Class EA was completed as a Schedule 'C' project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (2000), as amended in 2015. The Study has completed all necessary phases of the Municipal Class EA and is documented in the Environmental Study Report (ESR). Following the public review period, if there are no objections, the project will receive environmental clearance for construction.

The ESR will be available on public record for a 30-day public and agency review period from August 27 to October 2, 2020 at the following locations:

- County of Brant Administration Office, 26 Park Avenue, Burford
- Paris Customer Service Office, 66 Grand River Street North, Paris

The ESR will also be available for viewing of the County of Brant's website, [www.brant.ca/EA](http://www.brant.ca/EA) from August 27, 2020.

If there are any concerns regarding the project that cannot be resolved in discussion with the County, a person or party may request, in writing, that the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses Individual Environmental Assessments. Requests, with reasons, may be received by the Minister and Director of the Environmental Assessment and Permissions Branch of the MECP (at the addresses noted below) within 30 days of this notice, prior to October 2, 2020. The request must also be copied to the County's Project Manager identified below.
