

Outdoor Water Use Conservation Program

Lawn Watering	Permitted with a hose or sprinkler system every other day at specific times and dates. ¹	Use of hose or sprinkler system limited to one day per week at specific times and dates. ²	Not permitted.
Watering Gardens	Permitted with a hose or sprinkler system every other day at specific times and dates. ¹	Use of hose or sprinkler system limited to one day per week at specific times and dates. ² Permitted any time with a watering can.	Use of hose or sprinkler system not permitted. Permitted by watering can only at specific times and dates. ¹
Car Washing	Permitted with a hose every other day at specific times and dates. ¹ Hose must have shut-off nozzle.	Use of hose system limited to one day per week at specific times and dates. ² Hose must have shut-off nozzle.	Not permitted.
Washing Driveways, Decks, and Patios	Not permitted.	Not permitted.	Not permitted.
Filling Pools, Hot Tubs, Garden Ponds, or Fountains	Permitted every other day at specific times and dates. ¹	Limited to one day per week at specific times and dates. ²	Limited to one day per week at specific times and dates. ²

Notes:

1. The activity is permitted between 7:00 am and 9:00 am and 7:00 pm and 9:00 pm every other day according to municipal address. The activity is permitted at municipal addresses ending with an odd number on odd number calendar days and municipal addresses ending with an even number on even numbered calendar days.
2. The times are the same as in Note 1 above. The consumer can choose the day of the week according to the odd/even number protocol described in Note 1.

Public Notice

You are receiving this notice because you obtain municipal water from the **Mount Pleasant Drinking Water System** which services properties in the **County of Brant and the Tutela Heights area of Brantford.**

The County owns and operates the municipal drinking water system and will continue to provide water to properties in the Tutela Heights area until the City of Brantford is able to offer this service. Plans to transition this neighbourhood from the County to the City have begun and further details can be found at brantford.ca

Municipal water systems are designed to provide sufficient water for the average user as well as fire suppression. Further, Provincial legislation limits the amount of water the Mount Pleasant Drinking Water System can provide. This limit is based on the capacity of the groundwater wells to produce water, the process train to treat the water, and available storage.

Municipal water systems are not designed for significant outdoor water use. Excessive outdoor water use compromises the system's capability to meet the basic needs of users and fire suppression. This results in a ban on the outdoor use of water. A three-tiered conservation program has been developed to help share available water for essential uses amongst all consumers. Adherence to the conservation measures will eliminate the need for a ban on outdoor water use.

Water Conservation Program

The program consists of three levels: Green, Yellow and Red. These levels are based on the stresses on the water supply system. The current level will be communicated on the County of Brant website, social media channels and on roadside signs installed in the Mount Pleasant and Tutela Heights areas.

Look for this signage in your neighbourhood.

Green – The water supply system is operating normally. Supply is keeping up with demand. The normal conservation measures described in the *Water Conservation Notice* apply. Strict adherence to the conservation measures will prevent movement to Yellow.

Yellow – The water supply system is under stress. The amount of water used from the system is approaching supply capacity. To avoid the movement to Red, stringent conservation measures apply.


Red – The water supply system is approaching capacity. Restrictions on outdoor water use apply, including a ban on lawn irrigation. If the system enters the Red level, all properties using municipal water will receive a hand delivered notice informing of the outdoor water use ban.
